

The Law and Commandments of God: His Love and Wisdom Readings: Exodus 20:1-17, 1 Corinthians 1:22-25, John 2:13-25

The readings for the 3rd Sunday of Lent - Year B invite us to delve into the essence of God's law, rooted in His love and wisdom. The passage from Exodus 20 presents the Ten Commandments, a set of divine principles given by God to the Israelites. Delivered through Moses, these commandments are not mere restrictions but a pathway to freedom. The preamble, "I, the LORD, am your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, that place of slavery unto freedom," frames the commandments within the context of God's liberating love for His people.

In our contemporary world, where skepticism and resistance to limitations prevail, the question arises: Why follow these commandments? The answer lies in recognizing that God's laws are not constraints but the foundation of our freedom. They enable us to acknowledge God's identity and the liberation He provides to those who embrace His commands.

Despite our inclination to challenge boundaries and seek exceptions, the laws serve as guides for genuine human expression and relationships. Embracing these laws allows us to fully engage with our humanity, fostering relationships with both God and our fellow human beings. Paradoxically, what we resist in God's law is precisely what defines our humanity.

Though we may dislike limits, we are inherently limited beings. God's laws grant us the freedom to live harmoniously in a well-ordered world governed by divine love. The foundation of this divine love is evident in the sacrifice made by God, as articulated in 1 John 4:10. **not that we loved God**, but that **he loved us** first, he recused Israel from bondage and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins.

The gospel passage from John 2:13-25 cautions against taking God's love and freedom for granted. Jesus, through His actions in the Temple, symbolizes the consequences of disrespecting God's commands. The traders in the Temple abused their privileges, by overstepping the boundaries and occupying the sacred space set aside for worship The whip from Jesus serves as a reminder for us not to exploit/ abuse our freedom, privileges, and God's love.

As we navigate our earthly journey, we are entrusted with the stewardship of the world given to us by God. We are called to keep His commandments, mindful that our actions will be accounted for. The adage, "If you keep the law, the law will keep you," resonates with the truth that our obedience ensures the preservation of our spiritual well-being.
